#### The 7<sup>th</sup> Forum of Entities Associated with ASEAN: Strengthening Cooperation for ASEAN Community Building

ASEANSAI Secretariat attended the 7<sup>th</sup> Forum sustainable development goals. of Entities Associated with ASEAN, hosted ASEAN Secretariat (ASEC). The forum served as a platform for collaboration and dialogue among these entities, with a focus on advancing the ASEAN Community Vision 2025.

A significant highlight of this year's forum was the interface with the Secretary-General of ASEAN, Dr. Kao Kim Hourn. This marked the first face-to-face meeting between Dr. Kao and the entities since his appointment. Dr. Kao emphasized the importance of close collaboration between ASEC and the entities in achieving the goals of the ASEAN Community Vision 2025.

"The Secretary-General of ASEAN and ASEC must work closely with civil society organizations (CSOs), particularly those serving as ASEAN Entities, to find solutions that integrate socio-cultural aspects into the political-security economic and perspectives," stated Dr. Kao. He further emphasized that such collaboration would greatly benefit the people of ASEAN and uphold the spirit of regional integration.

Deputy Secretary-General (DSG) of ASEAN for Community and Corporate Affairs. Tran Duc Binh, opened the forum by underscoring the crucial role of the ASEAN Entities in shaping ASEAN's Post-2025 Vision. He highlighted their unique position in engaging with stakeholders on the ground and their potential to drive positive changes in the lives of ASEAN people, thereby contributing to

The forum commenced with a roundtable discussion among the entities on the theme of "Charting a Sustainable Future for ASEAN." This provided an opportunity for participants to share their perspectives and insights on advancing sustainable development within the ASEAN region.

ASEC's Programme Cooperation and Project Management Division also conducted a briefing, offering guidance on managing ASEAN cooperation projects (ACPs) through a results-based management approach. learned Participants about fund disbursements, reporting procedures, and how to access available resources for their projects, gaining valuable knowledge on the ASEAN project cycle.

The forum continues to serve as a vital platform for enhancing relations between ASEC, entities, sectoral bodies, ASEANrelated centers, and fostering cooperation among themselves. The German Federal Government provided support for this year's event through the GIZ cooperation project.



Several factors were highlighted as critical in enhancing the impact of performance audits, including the quality of the audit strategy and plan, the thoroughness of audit reports (including findings, conclusions, and recommendations), the responsiveness and follow-up actions by audited entities, and the communication strategy for issuing audit reports.
